



Angela Alsobrooks to serve as WMST graduation speaker

The WMST Public Charter High School Class of 2014, 89 strong, will graduate on June 5, 2014 at the Howard University's Cramton Auditorium in Washington, D.C. Prince George's County (Md.) State's Attorney Angela Alsobrooks, Esq., will serve as the Commencement Speaker at the 10 a.m. ceremony.

In 2010, Ms. Alsobrooks became the first female to be elected State's Attorney for Prince George's County. She leads a staff of 90 attorneys and 100 professional administrative staff who prosecute people accused of committing crimes in Prince George's County.

A lifelong county resident, Alsobrooks completed her undergraduate degree in public policy at Duke University and earned her law degree at the University of Maryland. Ms. Alsobrooks served as the county's first full-time Assistant State's Attorney dedicated to prosecuting domestic violence perpetrators. She tried scores of cases and successfully prosecuted violent offenders.

Before her election as Prince George's County's top prosecutor, Ms. Alsobrooks served the county as an education liaison and then as executive director of the Prince George's County Revenue Authority. That agency is responsible for facilitating economic development, financing capital improvement programs in the county and collecting revenues generated from county-owned parking facilities.
